FOR THE PUPIL

Meet Adventure George. He will appear in many of the tasks to lend a helping paw.



When George appears as a conductor, there will be musical examples for you to listen to. Click the examples, and George will try to conduct the music.



Writer George will open an online notepad for you to use for your written answers to some of the tasks. You can save your work and come back to it later, and then email it straight to your teacher.



Librarian George looks after lists of songs, books, and music that you can use to research the answers to some of the tasks.

Click on him to open a list - and try not to let him drop any books.

FOR THE TEACHER

The Music Challenge comprises Bronze, Silver, and Gold levels in classroom, instrumental, and singing tasks. Pupils complete eight out of 10 tasks in each section.

Certificates are awarded upon the successful complettion of each section.

The online functions of the Music Challenge allow teachers to keep track of their pupils' progress and creates certificates ready to be downloaded and printed whenever you want.



The Music Challenge is an interactive, online music learning experience which has been developed by members of the Society for Music Education (Canterbury). Initially released several years ago as the Capital Music Award Scheme, its success in classrooms has resulted in the modification and production of it as an online music programme The Music Challenge.
